


Plenty of culture. Plenty of history. Plenty of fun!



The Kulturzentrum Festung Ehrenbreitstein (Ehrenbreitstein Fortress Cultural Centre) sits perched on a mountain spur 118 m above the Rhine. Take the Stationen der Festungsgeschichte (Stations of Fortress History) discovery tour to learn more about the turbulent history of the city and the imposing complex, which you can explore on your own or with a guide.

TIP: The Landesmuseum Koblenz (Koblenz State Museum) with its four exhibition halls or one of the fascinating fortress tours.

And because learning is hungry work, you can enjoy homemade cakes and refreshments after the tour – on what is probably the most beautiful terrace in Koblenz, with a fantastic view of Deutsches Eck.

The old town of Koblenz is waiting for you with its unique charm: Romantic alleys, picturesque squares and lovingly designed courtyards invite you to experience the special atmosphere of this historic district. Feel over 2,000 years of the city's history with every step – from the Roman times to the present day.

Here you will find numerous important landmarks such as the Liebfrauenkirche (Church of Our Lady) and the Schängelbrunnen (Schängel Fountain), which exemplifies the Rhenish way of life. Cosy boutiques, creative artisan stores and traditional cafés give the streets a lively flair that invites you to linger and enjoy.



The adjacent city centre combines historical elements with modern urbanity: stylish shopping centres, elegant boutiques and the impressive Forum Confluentes – a striking blend of culture and modern architecture – provide plenty of opportunities to experience Koblenz from a fresh perspective.

Immerse yourself in the vibrant diversity of the Koblenz old town and city centre – a place with something special up its sleeve at any time of the year.

Deutsches Eck

(German Corner)

History and nature grow together to create a fascinating experience at Deutsches Eck. Stand at the tip of the headland, the majestic confluence of Father Rhine and Mother Moselle, and enjoy the stunning view of two of Europe's most beautiful rivers. Not only is this world-famous landmark a historical site, it is also a place to admire and discover.

From a historical perspective, the corner building with the stone cross just behind the Kaiser-Denkmal (Kaiser Wilhelm Monument) was named 'Deutsches Eck' (German Corner) in 1216 as it was the local commandry of the Teutonic Order. The headland known today as Deutsches Eck and the monument were then added in the 19th century. Its highlight, the over 60-tonne Kaiser-Denkmal (Kaiser Wilhelm Monument), depicts the first emperor of the new German Empire, Kaiser Wilhelm I. (1797–1888).

Destroyed during the Second World War, it was declared a memorial to German unity from 1953 to 1990. The huge equestrian statue was returned to its original site after the fall of the Berlin Wall, its reconstruction funded by civic initiatives and ultimately a private donation.

TIP: The impressive head of the original imperial monument is still on show in the Mittelrhein-Museum (Middle Rhine Museum).

Situated behind, the Deutschherrenhaus has been home to the Ludwig Museum – which exhibits post-1945 French art – since 1992. The Basilika St. Kastor (Basilica of St. Castor), the most richly traditional church in Koblenz, is accessed via the historic Blumenhof. Built between 817 and 836 AD, it is an outstanding example of Romanesque architecture on the Middle Rhine. It was an important gathering place for emperors and kings.

Set off from Deutsches Eck to the Kulturzentrum Festung Ehrenbreitstein (Ehrenbreitstein Fortress Cultural Centre) with the Landesmuseum Koblenz (Koblenz State Museum).

A ride on the cable car belongs on every bucket list during a visit to Koblenz. The 850-metre long ride over the Rhine takes around seven minutes. The Koblenz cable car is 100% barrier-free and can transport up to 7,600 passengers per hour.

Enjoy a bird's eye view of the Upper Middle Rhine Valley UNESCO World Heritage Site from one of the panoramic cabins. Guaranteed to take your breath away – even the second, third and fourth time!

And there is plenty more to discover once you reach the top. Set off on a stroll to experience and explore the Kulturzentrum Festung Ehrenbreitstein (Ehrenbreitstein Fortress Cultural Centre): the magnificent fortress park with its vantage point, adventure playground, AdventureGolf – and of course an absolute must: Festung Ehrenbreitstein (Ehrenbreitstein Fortress) itself!

Naturally, visitors can climb aboard the cable car at the mountain station and sail down to Deutsches Eck.



FORTRESS PLATEAU & THE EHRENBREITSTEIN DISTRICT

The Festung Ehrenbreitstein (Ehrenbreitstein Fortress) casts a spell on you with its impressive location on a rocky plateau above the confluence of the Rhine and Moselle rivers.

People have been enthralled by the striking mountain for over 3,000 years. Initially used as a place of refuge, it was later developed into a Prussian fortress, one of the largest in Europe. Today, metre-thick walls, sweeping moats, mysterious tunnels and mighty gates bear witness to the turbulent history of this extraordinary place.

The modern Cultural Centre invites you in to bring the past to life. Aside from fascinating exhibitions and a variety of events, visitors can also enjoy culinary highlights and a breathtaking panoramic view of the surrounding Rhine landscape.

TIP: Explore the fortress on the Stationen der Festungsgeschichte (Stations of Fortress History) adventure tour, which starts directly at the main entrance. Exciting exhibits, models as well as film and sound recordings bring the site's eventful past back to life. Follow in the footsteps of the Prussian soldiers and immerse yourself in the fascinating history of this unique location!
